Brief Description of Program:

\$1,265,316 for fiscal year 2008-2009 is authorized to award existing senior centers and developing programs with operational funding. Funding can be used for any purpose that supports the ongoing operation or development of the senior center. A developing senior center refers to the temporary status of a newly established center that is working towards becoming a multipurpose center or a satellite center within three years of its initial designation as a developing center. If a developing center does not achieve status as a multipurpose center or satellite center after three years, General Purpose Funding is terminated. The Division of Aging and Adult Services allocates funding to area agencies on aging to make an award to designated senior centers. State funds allocated to area agencies on aging are stated on the area agency's notification of grant award from the Division for the period 7/1/08 through 6/30/09. Awards to senior centers require 25% local matching.
