Brief Description of Program:

Technical assistance and limited financial resources are provided to underserved communities in developing and maintaining primary health care centers. The objective of the Rural Health Centers Capital Grant Program is to assist in making primary health care services and limited integrated behavioral health services available and accessible to residents of underserved populations who would otherwise be unable to receive these needed services, due to geographic, economic, or other barriers. Capital funding is provided to assist rural and underserved communities with the renovation and equipping of rural health center facilities.
