## **Brief Description of Program:**

Project C.A.R.E. (<u>Caregiver Alternatives to Running on Empty</u>) provides critical comprehensive support, include respite care vouchers, to vulnerable unpaid family caregivers of individuals living with Alzheimer's disease or other related dementia. The program effectively reaches isolated rural and minority communities through culturally sensitive outreach strategies with a unique family-centered, in-home intervention. Project C.A.R.E. aims to minimize State expenses and maximize the family's potential to provide the most appropriate, high quality and cost effective care in the least restrictive setting thus delaying or preventing the need for institutionalization.
