# Brief Description of Program

The purpose of the Pregnancy Care Management funding for Uninsured Women Ineligible for Medicaid is to provide specialized prenatal and postpartum care management services to low income women ineligible for Medicaid. The goal of Pregnancy Care Management services is to prevent adverse pregnancy outcomes and improve birth outcomes, with a particular focus on reducing the rate of preterm birth.

Many women in North Carolina enter pregnancy with medical and psychosocial risk factors that affect their health and the health of their infants. Pregnancy Care Management Services consist of interventions provided by a nurse or a social worker, during and after pregnancy, to increase access to needed medical, education, and social services, in order to address these factors that impact poor maternal and infant health outcomes, including infant mortality. Care management services includes: assessment, intervention, referrals and coordination of care.
