The system provides an electronic view of Year-to-Date (YTD) financial reports in response to requests for confirmation from independent auditors.

The auditor should not consider the Supplement to be “safe harbor” for identifying audit procedures to apply in a particular engagement, but the auditor should be prepared to justify departures from the suggested procedures. The auditor can consider the supplement a “safe harbor” for identification of compliance requirements to be tested if the auditor performs reasonable procedures to ensure that the requirements in the Supplement are current.

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I. PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

The NC State Improvement Project (NC SIP) provides personnel development, programming, and system implementation support services to significantly improve the performance and success of students with disabilities in local education agencies (LEA), charter schools and state-operated programs in North Carolina. Funds support the implementation of research-based practices in reading, mathematics, adolescent literacy, co-teaching, and leadership's understanding of system implementation of research-based practices.

The goals established to accomplish the purpose of this State Personnel Development Grant are:

GOAL 1 - NC SIP staff will increase their capacity to provide leadership, professional development, coaching, and supports to participating districts, schools, teachers, and families on leadership and effective reading, math, and content literacy instruction.

GOAL 2 - District and building administrators will have the skills to develop, implement, evaluate, and sustain district plans that support the improvement of core content instruction and achievement of students with disabilities in their districts.

GOAL 3 - Teachers and administrators will have the skills to effectively implement evidence-based reading, math, and content literacy for students with disabilities in the birth-12 classrooms, which will lead to increased student engagement, student generalization of skills, academic achievement, and family engagement.

GOAL 4 - Pre-service teachers and in-service administrators enrolled in partnering IHEs, will have the capacity to effectively implement and support research-based reading, math, and content literacy for students with disabilities.

II. PROGRAM PROCEDURES

Each LEA, charter school and state-operated program is provided an opportunity to submit an application for selection to participate in the NC State Improvement Project (NC SIP).

Funds are allocated annually to LEAs, charter schools and state-operated programs selected. The amount of funds allocated is based on state level assessment of local needs, and the LEA's readiness for the level of engagement.

III. COMPLIANCE REQUIREMENTS

If the Matrix indicates "Y," the auditor must determine if a particular type of compliance requirement has a direct and material effect on the federal program for the auditee. A. Activities Allowed or Unallowed

Compliance Requirement – Funds may be used by a LEA, charter school or state-operated program only in accordance with State and Federal laws, regulations and policies, and only for those services or activities included in its application and/or 5-year strategic plans.

Audit Objective – To determine that expenditures are allowable and are properly recorded.

Suggested Audit Procedures:

- Obtain a copy of the Budget Balance Reconciliation Report (305/705) from the finance officer and compare to local accounting records for conformity.
- Obtain a copy of the NC SIP application and/or implementation plan and review expenditures to determine that expenditures are in accordance with the project application/plan.

E. Eligibility

- Determine whether NC SIP funds were used to pay for services to students who are ineligible to participate in the program. If NC SIP funds were used for such children, ascertain the amount of those funds so used.

Eligibility for Subrecipients – The Department of Public Instruction program consultant determines if the eligibility requirements are met when the project application and budget are approved.

F. Equipment and Real Property Management
